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NZCLT Scholarship Regulation

The Waikato Institute of Education NZCLT Scholarship was established to foster and assist students and to promote education opportunities for learners who are dedicated to teaching language and pursuing their own professional development.

1. Eligibility

1.1 To be eligible, all applicants must:

- A. be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, or be an Australian citizen, or hold a current Australian resident return visa;
- B. and not be eligible for fees-free study in any tertiary school;

1.2 In the meantime, applicants also need to meet one of the following circumstances:

1.2.1 If applicants have studied in a New Zealand high school and have any qualification in New Zealand, they must:

- A. demonstrate high academic achievement, **or**
- B. prove academic potential, **or**
- C. have language teaching experience, **or**
- D. excellence in Te Reo, Tikanga or Kapa Haka.

1.2.2 If applicants only have qualifications from overseas, they must fulfil one of criteria A - C from 1.2.1, and also must meet the course entry requirement.

1.2.3 Demonstrate the applicant has financial circumstances that are severely constrained.

2. Value and Tenure

2.1 The scholarship will have a value up to NZD\$3160 and will be applied directly towards the recipient's tuition fee once their enrolment is completed.

2.2 The tenure is one intake and the Scholarship is valid only within the intake for which it is awarded.

3. Application

3.1 Applications for the Scholarship must be received by Waikato Institute of Education marketing team by :

- A. 1 months before course start date;
- B. 2 weeks before course start date (if places are available)

3.2 As part of the application process, each application must:

- A. Provide the proof of ID and New Zealand/Australian residency (including one of the following: passport, visa, Certificate of Identity, or New Zealand/Australian Birth Certificate if passport is unavailable);
- B. Submit a Personal Statement detailing background, experience and reasons for choosing this course;
- C. Provide a current CV;
- D. Provide the certificate or degree of highest qualification;
- E. Provide the transcript of highest qualification;
- F. Provide a reference Letter which should not be from an immediate family member (if applicable).

4. Selection Panel and Criteria

- 4.1 Scholarships will be prioritised for eight candidates based on academic merit, future potential to become excellent students or language teachers, and community involvement in Maori community.
- 4.2 Scholarships will be offered for two candidates who are significantly disadvantaged in accessing education. If there is less than two candidates meet this criteria, these spots will be transferred to 4.1 criteria.
- 4.3 Applications will be shortlisted by the marketing team and forwarded to the Selection Panel.
- 4.4 The Selection Panel will comprise the General Manager and Programme Coordinator.
- 4.5 The Selection Panel's decisions are final and no further correspondence will be entered into following the selection meeting.

5. Awarding

- 5.1 Applicants will be advised of the result of their application in writing following the selection meeting.
- 5.2 Successful applicants will receive a Scholarship Agreement which is valid for two weeks. Students must confirm their acceptance of Scholarships by the date requested, and email or post back the signed agreement form, after which time the offer of Scholarship will automatically lapse and no longer be valid.
- 5.3 Before the scholarship valid date, students must complete their enrolment, if the enrolment is not completed the offer of Scholarship will be withdrawn.

6. Other Conditions

- 6.1 The Scholarship is not refundable to the student.
- 6.2 For any of the following reasons, the Scholarships Executive may terminate a Scholarship and recoup any funds dispersed if a recipient:
 - A. withdraws from the course,
 - B. does not complete the NZCLT Level 5 qualification,
 - C. is otherwise not complying with the regulations governing the scholarship.
- 6.3 In signing and returning the Scholarship Agreement form, the student will be deemed to have read, understood and accepted the regulations of this Scholarship.
- 6.4 Recipients of this Scholarship agree to participate, if required, in any promotional activity and events organised by Waikato Institute of Education during the tenure of the Scholarship.
